### Who is eligible

**Meritorious Service Decorations** are given to recognize contributions in any field, from advocacy and health care services to research and humanitarian efforts. Recipients have tackled poverty in their community, improved education opportunities for children in Canada and abroad, or raised awareness of important causes and issues.

Both Canadians and non-Canadians who have made a significant contribution to Canada are eligible. The decorations can also be awarded posthumously, as long as the initiative was undertaken after 1984.

#### How recipients are selected

Each nomination is carefully researched and then reviewed by an independent advisory committee, which makes recommendations to the Governor General.

There are two levels of recognition: a cross and a medal. The different levels reflect the scope and impact of the contribution.

The Chancellery of Honours, which manages the program, will contact each successful candidate. Nominators are also informed of the results of their nomination.

Presentation ceremonies are held throughout the year, in communities across Canada.

# How to submit a nomination

Nominations can be made through the Governor General's website at **Merit.gg.Ca**.

#### To submit a nomination, please send us the following information:

The name and address of your candidate(s), as well as your own name and address, for correspondence purposes.



A description of the reasons for the nomination, outlining what the candidate has done, for how long and the impact of the candidate's work.



The names and contact information of three (3) references who can speak to the candidate's achievements with concrete examples.

There is no deadline for submissions. Nominations are accepted throughout the year.

All nominations are kept confidential to respect privacy and to avoid disappointment if the nominee is not selected. Nominators, references, and others involved in the process are asked to respect this policy.
