2. What are the names of the organizations that the candidate has volunteered with?

- Ottawa Food Bank
- Our Children Our Future family resources, Ottawa
- Animal Welfare Fund, Gatineau

3. <u>During which years was the candidate active with each volunteer organization?</u>

- Ottawa Food Bank (2001 to 2017)
- Our Children Our Future family resources (2020 to Present)
- Animal Welfare Fund (2019 to Present)

4. What are the candidate's specific volunteer tasks, duties or responsibilities?

- Ottawa Food Bank: Assists in the management and general administration of the warehouse, including maintenance projects.
- Our Children Our Future family resources: Plans and executes the organizations main annual fundraising event. Duties include promoting the event, recruiting volunteers, managing various teams and providing communications support.
- Animal Welfare Fund: Assists animals in need by visiting shelters on a daily basis to perform tasks such as cleaning of facilities, feeding and providing administrative support.

5. How has the nominee's volunteer work impacted their community?

- Through the Food Bank program, the nominee has helped provide nutritional support to over 5,000 households in Ottawa through the donation and delivery of food.
- Through the Family Resource Centre, the nominee has helped ensure a brighter future for children by providing resources and time to create and sustain educational spaces where children can thrive.
- Through the Animal Welfare program, the nominee has helped keep animals safe and healthy while they await adoption.

6. How much time has the nominee devoted to volunteering with each organization per week, month or year?

- The Food Bank program required a commitment of approximately three to four hours per week.
- The fundraising event planning required a commitment of approximately 50 hours yearly.
- The Animal Welfare program required a commitment of approximately 10 hours monthly.

7. What is your relation to the nominee? Have you volunteered with them in any capacity?

The nominee is a friend that I have known for 10 years. We met at the Ottawa Food Bank and have volunteered together since.
